BK01	The Grand Palace And The Emerald Buddha, Wat Phra Kaeo ( 3 hours)	<p>The Grand Palace was built in 1782 at the same time as Wat Phra Kaeo to act as the official residence of the king. King Chulalongkorn was the last king to live there, subsequent monarchs residing at the less formal Chitralada Palace in Dusit district. Today, the palace is used for certain ceremonial occasions such as Coronation Day. A few government buildings within the compound are still functioning.</p> <p><b>Dusit Throne Hall:</b> The cross-shaped Dusit Throne Hall with its magnificent multi-tiered spire is one of the finest examples of Rattanakosin architecture. Originally used as a venue for royal audiences, the hall is currently used for the annual Coronation Day ceremonies. Inside this building is the fabulous mother-of-pearl throne, used since the first monarch of the Chakri Dynasty.</p> <p><b>Chakri Throne Hall:</b> This is the largest of the palace buildings and is often known as the Grand Palace Hall. Designed by the British architect John Chinitz, the building exhibits a bizarre blend of European and Thai architecture. The central 'mondop', the tiered spire on the roof, houses the ashes of each of the Chakri kings, while the flanking mondops enshrine the ashes of princes who never inherited the throne.</p> <p><b>Boromphiman Hall:</b> Built by King Rama V as a residence for the crown prince, the Boromphiman Hall is designed in neo-classical European style. Today, the hall is still occasionally used to accommodate visiting dignitaries.</p> <p><b>Maha Monthien Hall:</b> Located east of the Chakri Throne Hall, this complex actually includes three buildings, the Amarindra Audience Hall, the Phaisan Taksin Hall and the Chakraphat Phiman Hall. BK02	Temples and City Tour ( 3 hours)	<p>This tour takes you to three of the most famous temples in Bangkok.</p> <p>Wat Traimit, the Temple of the Golden Buddha, was built to house its astonishing Buddha image. The Golden Buddha is made of solid gold, is more than 3 meters high, and weights 5.5 tons. The Buddha was discovered by an accident in 1955 when a crane dropped an old stucco Buddha, shattered the plaster shell, and revealed the shining gold underneath.</p> <p>Wat Po, the Temple of the Reclining Buddha, is Bangkok's oldest and largest temple. The gigantic gold plated reclining Buddha with inlaid mother-of-pearl soles is highly revered among Buddhists. The Wat is also a center for traditional medicine, of which the famous Institute of Massage is a part.</p> <p>Wat Benjamabophit, The Marble Temple, is the last major temple to be built in central Bangkok. BK03	Jim Thomsom's World Famous Thai House, Vimanmek Mansion Palace and Suan Pakkad Palace ( 4 hours)	<p>Jim Thompson's Thai House; this remarkable Thai-style house, was the work of Mr. Jim Thompson, an American who came to Thailand at the end of The Second World War and revived the Thai Silk industry.</p> <p>Vimanmek Mansion Palace, the world's largest building made entirely of golden teak.</p> <p>Suan Pakkard Palace; there is a complex of five traditional Thai House, overlooking a beautifully kept garden.
